

Bid Letting and Quoting Reminders

- When working with new primes reach out early and introduce yourself and what you do.
- Need a capability statement? The **DBE Office** can help!
- Haven't worked on WisDOT jobs for a while? Check in with primes you've worked with before to let them know you are interested and available.

The DBE Office receives consistent feedback from prime contractors that the following are the **top three** areas to improve with respect to quotes. We are highlighting this feedback so that you can optimize your internal processes.

- If some of your work items receive DBE credit and some do not, **make it clear** to the prime on your quote.
 - Review your NAICS codes on the <u>Directory</u>.
 - Consider requesting an <u>expansion</u> for any work area you perform but do not receive credit for.
- Send quotes to primes as **early** as possible before a letting.
 - Prime contractors are under strict deadlines on letting day- make sure you give them enough time to properly evaluate your quote.
 - Sending quotes in early helps your company receive adequate consideration and prime contractors to submit responsive bids.
- Complete your Attachment A with the amount you can receive total credit for and the amount of your full quote and sign it.

Another Successful CBG DBE Roundtable Conference

CBG DBE ROUNDTABLE CONFERENCE 2023

The Construction Business Group's (CBG) DBE Development Initiative (DBEDI) wrapped up another successful conference at the Wisconsin Dell's Wilderness Resort in the Glacier Canyon Lodge with sessions that provided tremendous insights to attendees.

his year's 2nd annual conference, which is in partnership with the State of Wisconsin's DBE Program, featured a wide variety of content to the attendees. There were also several new people in attendance looking for industry-specific information pertaining to the heavy highway industry.

The conference convened with Executive Director Robb Kahl thanking those in attendance for their commitment to expanding their knowledge through the conference content and providing excellent work as prime contractors and sub-contractors. He then introduced special guests Terry McGowan, Chairman of the CBG Board of Directors and President/Business Manager – IUOE Local 139, and Craig Thompson, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Secretary.

Terry delivered a candid message of commitment from the members of Local 139 to grow and build capacity in DBE signatory subcontractors. This is the essential part of the DBEDI so that the industry, through its contractors, will continue to provide the best trained road building workers. After Terry's message, Secretary Thompson delivered a message of support for CBG and its ongoing partnership with the WisDOT's DBE Program. Secretary Thompson highlighted the CBG/WisDOT partnership, efforts to improve access to financial capital, and the continuing education for the sub-contractors through CBG's Master Class.

After the welcome messages, the conference was in full swing with the topic of "How DBE Sub-contractors Can Bid as Prime Contractors". This session featured Christy



Wade of Arbor Green, Craig Clements of Pro2Pave, and other panelist as the discussion ventured into what it takes to elevate your business to become a prime contractor in the heavy highway industry which would allow you to contract directly with WisDOT. There was additional dialog on the precautionary steps you need to consider while achieving this milestone as a construction business and the necessary capital needed for implementation.

After a brief break, Robb facilitated a panel discussion on "How can DBEs Access Affordable Capital". This session's platform focused on the preparedness, proper documentation, a track record of making good financial decisions, and relationship building with the financial institutions as the DBE seeks financial capital for increasing their opportunities in the heavy highway industry. WisDOT's DBE Program Chief Madalena Maestri and I have been working on this issue as a joint effort as a capacity building tool with certified DBEs who provide work as sub-contractors in the heavy highway industry.

Another Successful CBG DBE Roundtable Conference

Over a working lunch, the Small Business Development Center, through their Capital Access Clinic, led a discussion on the importance of knowing cashflow analysis and income balance statements for businesses and how to self-perform these essential tools. SBDC/CAC has been a partner with CBG for over a year and has taken our clients' financial needs and prepared them to become bankable. One of IUOE Local 139 signatory contractors, VanZile Contractors, has successfully used this partnership through CBG. Also, during the luncheon, graduates of CBG's DBEDI Master Class were granted their Certificate of Completion.

The afternoon session focused on "Industry Tools and Best Practices" from the prime contractors' perspective. Matt Grove from WTBA facilitated the session and contractors that led this discussion were Neil Bakke, President of Mathy Construction, Jeff Parisis, the Director of Business Development for the Walbec Group, and Eric Bertram, General Manager of Edgerton Contractors. Their collective experience in the road building heavy highway industry was invaluable to the conference attendees. The discussion surrounded how a prime contractor builds a long-term relationship with the DBE, and what the expectations are surrounding a solid working relationship. The sentiment was the same whether you are a medium or large size prime contractor, communication between



the prime contractor and DBE is essential to completing projects.

WisDOT presented their session on "New WisDOT DBE Initiatives" and shared information on the certification process, financial tools that are available, mentor/protege program, and their supportive services. Because of WisDOT's regulatory authority, their session was key to the conference and the opportunity that sub-contractors could pursue to become certified as a DBE.

We wrapped up the conference with our signature Roundtable Discussions on the benefits of becoming a signatory contractor with the Operating Engineers facilitated by Local 139 District D Manager Shane Griesbach. The attendees were randomly assigned and rotated to different tables to engage in discussions from

facilitators who where our subject matter experts that presented and participated in our Master Class curriculum. The facilitators expanded their information to advance knowledge of the road building industry and challenged the attendees to join the productive partnerships that the industry provides. One contractor at a time, we are Building Wisconsin Together®.

Ensuring that DBEs have access to opportunities and excel on WisDOT construction projects



In 2012, Paul started his career with DOT as an Equal Opportunity Specialist for the DBE Program, learning and implementing the rules and regulations according to 49 CFR Part 26. His core mission was to ensure that all contractors and subcontractors including DBE firms were complying with FHWA and USDOT regulations and requirements. He focused on providing resources to DBE firms with subcontracts on WisDOT construction projects. Paul continues to use his customer service skills to engage certified firms who desire to work with DOT by assisting the firms in navigating WisDOT's processes, proposals, websites, and systems. His efforts help to increase DBE firm knowledge of DOT operations leading to expanded access and better performance on Wisconsin heavy highway and aeronautics construction projects.

Paul's role as the first DBE Trucking Utilization Specialist was created to educate and support DBE certified trucking firms working on DOT projects. He revised the Trucking Utilization Policy, informs all DBE trucking firms of the required documentation, and assists firms with contractor compliance requirements. While a challenging role, it is also very gratifying to see the difference this support makes for small firms.

University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Study

UWM STUDIES WISDOT DBE PROGRAM

WORKING TOWARD A HIGHER STANDARD OF SERVICE

he Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program has made a marked improvement recently in its mission to attain a higher standard of service and efficiency. But rather than rest on their laurels, program leaders work toward continued improvement.

With that attitude, WisDOT's DBE program enlisted the help of researchers at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's Institute for Physical Infrastructure & Transportation (IPIT) to conduct a **study** with the goals of streamlining the existing operation, ensuring a more robust program and maximizing DBEs' participation in federally funded transportation projects.

The research confirmed that WisDOT has been a national leader in offering a wide array of support services to DBEs. It also noted several areas where the program can improve.

Current state of WisDOT's DBE program

Compared to Wisconsin, 20 state DOTs have higher reported percentages of established DBE goals and 15 state DOTs have higher reported percentages of attained DBE goals. However, those findings are based on average three-year data until 2019. And WisDOT has met its goal three consecutive years dating back to FFY21.

The main reason for that improvement is WisDOT's knowledgeable and dedicated staff at the Support Services Office. The team was noted in the study for its ability to make strategic partnerships with prime contractors and other stakeholders while also holding them accountable for meeting DBE goal requirements and minimizing approval of GFE requests.

The most beneficial service the WisDOT team provides was deemed to be the Annual DBE Workshop and Networking Summit as more than 70% of DBEs who participated in the UWM survey were familiar with the event.

There remain hurdles in this area, including workforce attrition, funding constraints and the ongoing challenge of building the ranks of qualified DBEs statewide.

The researchers suggested WisDOT needs to develop a strategic plan to help set directions for the operation of DBE program and strategic offering of support services to DBEs. With investment and implementation of the strategic plan, WisDOT can enhance DBEs' participation and success.

Barriers to DBEs' success

Different DBEs have unique needs to grow and become successful, which makes a strategic plan that much more important. The consensus among the stakeholders surveyed was that the state's DBEs face many hurdles, including: a lack of business and management knowledge, access to capital, bonding and insurance, adequate financial and human capacity, strategic support services, adequate guidelines and communication, prompt payments for completed work and opportunities for strategic networking with peers and primes.

The study also makes note of the percentages of DBE contracts awarded to white female business owners in the program in recent years. In FFY21, just over 30% of WisDOT's certified DBE firms were owned by white women. Those firms collectively won roughly 60% of all DBE contracts. The DBE program continues to work with all firms to facilitate the most competitive environment for work.

Searching for solutions

The UWM research team compiled a set of recommendations to enhance the participation and success of DBEs in the state. Chief among them was developing a pilot training and onboarding program to help grow existing DBE firms and create new ones. WisDOT could take advantage of the resources already in place as well as build partnerships with educational institutions and local engineering and construction organizations.

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University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Study

Another suggestion was to revise contract award policies, to the extent possible, to provide allowance for DBEs not being the lowest bids, request or recommend certain projects be awarded to DBEs, and structure contracts so that primes pay DBEs upfront money as start-up funds.

Another idea involved develop an accreditation system for DBEs who complete various training programs and enter their scores and credentials into a public database to highlight such DBEs' qualification and to promote them for new contract awards. Along with that, WisDOT could assist qualified DBEs by publicizing their business portfolios and highlighting their areas of specialty through newsletters and short presentations at DBE events.

To address the monetary constraints, WisDOT could create a pool of certified DBEs within the state, or nationally, and negotiate with financial institutions for better rates on loans, insurance and bonding opportunities.

A path to success

The key to all these suggestions is that there is still a lot of potential avenues WisDOT could take in helping to clear hurdles for DBE firms. Most primes surveyed view DBEs as an asset to the industry and compare them equally with non-DBE firms, except for some of the deficiencies described above. The dearth of qualified DBEs continues to be a concern for primes, which is a major problem for the design and construction industry in the state.

Commissioning this study was an important first step for WisDOT toward addressing the issues that stand in the way of the DBE program's path to success. Now is the time to enact change. This is a major opportunity that will place WisDOT as the national leader in developing successful DBEs who could significantly contribute to the economic development and growth of the state and the region.

ZOO INTERCHANGE PROJECTCOMPLETED WITH OVER 12.2% IN DBE PARTICIPATION

Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Secretary Craig Thompson joined federal, state and local leaders in the city of Wauwatosa in early November to celebrate finishing the North Leg of the Zoo Interchange. Reaching this major milestone also signified the overall completion of the entire Zoo Interchange project in Milwaukee County, which finished \$200 million under budget.

n 2019, Gov. Evers made a promise to finish the North Leg of the Zoo Interchange, so we rolled up our sleeves and went to work," Thompson said. "We kept our promise, and I am extremely proud to stand here today with community leaders to celebrate this once-in-a-lifetime achievement. Together we are delivering safe and reliable access to neighborhoods and businesses and providing quality infrastructure to efficiently move goods and services to reach all corners of Wisconsin."

An important component that helped get this project across the finish line was the hard work of DBE firms. The entire Zoo Interchange had 12.2% DBE participation that involved 165 firms.

As one of the busiest stretches of roadway in the state, the Zoo Interchange is a critical hub for commerce and tourism throughout Wisconsin. There are about 108,000 jobs located within two miles of the Zoo Interchange. It is the main access route to local manufacturers, and it connects Milwaukee to the Fox Valley industrial region. In addition, more than 20,000 trucks a day travel this section of highway carrying more than \$20 billion in freight each year.

"We have a responsibility to maintain and enhance our roads and highways throughout Milwaukee County. That's why I'm pleased to see the final leg of the State of Wisconsin's Zoo Interchange project cross the finish line to begin serving our residents, commuters and visitors," Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley said. "Now that the Zoo Interchange is complete, we can begin to realize the full economic impact and quality-of-life benefits that this project will deliver for our community."

This project also had a major impact on WisDOT meeting its assigned goal for DBE participation for the third straight year. In FFY2023, 14.42% of the federal funds authorized





for the state's highway and transit financial assistance programs was expended on DBEs.

The North Leg is the final segment to complete the Zoo Interchange. This 1.7-mile reconstruction project, which began in early 2021, expanded I-41 to eight lanes from Swan Boulevard to Burleigh Street in Wauwatosa. The project reconstructed the Burleigh Street and North Avenue interchanges and built a new bridge for the Union Pacific Railroad as well as replaced bridges at Mayfair Road/WIS 100; North Avenue and Meinecke Street. In addition, crews built several retaining walls and noise barriers along the interstate corridor.

DBE COACHING



by a Prime Contractor or Professional Consultant

WHAT IS DBE COACHING?

DBE coaching is when a prime contractor or professional consultant meets with a DBE subcontractor or subconsultant to help optimize their performance and ability to achieve successful outcomes on WisDOT projects.

Coaching can help a DBE advance in their trade by teaching new skills and strengthening existing skills. The DBE coach can assist with creating an action plan in coordination with the DBE Office to achieve specific outcomes, such as setting up office efficiencies, identifying niche areas of work and potential work type expansions, and suggesting areas for training. A coach may observe the DBE practice specific skills and recommend areas for improvement.

DBE coaching can also provide encouragement and help DBEs gain confidence in their abilities, become stronger in their assigned NAICS code work areas, and propose expansions where applicable.

The coach helps the DBE gain insight into their strengths and identify areas for growth as they move along the path to successfully contracting with WisDOT.

Coaches provide guidance and expertise for working on WisDOT projects and help DBEs:



- Identify opportunities
- Improve productivity
- Overcome obstacles
- Stay focused and motivated
- Set business-related goals and objectives to create a path to success
- Identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats/risks
- Evaluate prime contracting goals
