Purpose of Public Involvement

- Our objective is to obtain your input on the following:
 - Proposed improvements
 - Impacts to traffic during construction





Project Location







- WisDOT is proposing to improve 7.1 miles of WIS 73
- Limits Neshkoro to Wautoma, White River Bridge to WIS 21
- Purpose and Need
 - The existing asphaltic pavement is exhibiting signs of deterioration in the form of longitudinal and transverse cracking as well as alligator cracking
 - The County YY intersection has been identified as having safety concerns





- Proposed Improvements
 - Removing and replacing 1-2 inches of the existing asphalt pavement
 - 2-inch mill and overlay from the White River Bridge to Bluff Street and from County F to WIS 21
 - 1-inch mill and 2-inch overlay from Bluff Street to County F
 - Modifying the County YY intersection to address safety concerns
 - Replacing one deteriorated culvert under WIS 73 near Silver Lake
 - Extend or replace cross road culvert at Cottonville Drive
 - Upgrading curb ramps in Neshkoro to meet current standards
 - Addressing drainage concerns in the NW quadrant of the White River Bridge




- Proposed Improvements County YY Intersection modifications
 - History of westbound vehicles on County YY failing to yield to southbound vehicles on WIS 73
 - 3 crashes at the intersection for 2016 2020 with this crash pattern





WIS 73 and County YY Crash Diagram







- Proposed Improvements County YY Intersection modifications
 - To address the identified crash pattern, a minor realignment of County YY on the east leg was selected as the preferred alternative
 - Addresses the crash pattern with low impacts and cost
 - Realigns the east leg of County YY to reduce the skew of the intersection improving vehicle sight lines





County YY Preferred Alternative: Minor Realignment of East Leg







- Archaeological Surveys will be performed in September/October 2023
 - Project representatives will be on site and may require access to private property
 - Notice will be provided to landowners prior to any surveys being performed





Proposed Traffic Impacts

- WIS 73 to remain open to traffic during construction using flagging operations
- County YY
 - East leg planned to be closed for 3-4 weeks
 - West leg to be open with staged construction
- Temporary pedestrian facilities may be provided while curb ramps are under construction
- Local and emergency access will be maintained





Real Estate

- Majority of work will occur within existing highway right-of-way
- Permanent fee right of way acquisition anticipated at County YY and the NW quadrant of the White River Bridge.
- Temporary limited easements at the curb ramps may be required
- Acquisition process
 - WisDOT will acquire real estate
 - Real estate staff will meet with impacted property owners
 - Begin real estate acquisitions in spring 2024
- Landowner rights brochure is available on the project website

- Construction currently scheduled for 2026
