

Saturday, Oct. 20, 2018, is National Move Over Day. When approaching law enforcement or other emergency vehicles, tow trucks, road machinery, highway construction or maintenance vehicles, public utility, telecommunication carrier or cooperative association vehicles stopped on or near a highway and using flashing warning lights, you must move into a lane not nearest the stopped vehicle and travel in that lane until you have safely passed the stopped vehicle(s). If it is unsafe to move into another lane, slow down until you have safely passed the stopped vehicle(s).

National Move Over Day!

In Wisconsin, drivers must provide a safety zone for stopped law enforcement, emergency and maintenance vehicles.

To help safeguard law enforcement officers, emergency responders, road maintenance workers, and others who work on the side of highways, Wisconsin has a "Move Over Law."

The law requires drivers to shift lanes or slow down in order to provide a "safety zone" for a squad car, ambulance, fire truck, tow truck, utility vehicle, or highway maintenance vehicle that is stopped on the side of a road with its warning lights flashing.

Drivers have two options for creating a safety zone:

** If the road has more than one directional lane, like the Interstate, and you can switch lanes safely, you must move over to vacate the lane closest to the law enforcement or other vehicle with its lights flashing.
** If the road has a single directional lane or you can't safely move over, you must reduce your speed.

Failure of motorists to move over is one of the reasons that motor vehicle crashes kill more law enforcement officers on duty than any other cause. #MoveOver #MoveOverSlowDown #WeAllGoHome #SafeIncidents

This Saturday, October 17, 2020 is National Move Over Day. The Adams County Sheriff's Office is participating in this national awareness campaign to help make drivers aware of their responsibility when approaching stopped emergency vehicles on the roadway.

Every year, law enforcement officers, fire fighters, emergency medics, highway workers, and tow truck operators are injured or killed on Wisconsin's roadways by drivers who fail to move over. Our first responders frequently work in dangerous conditions which is why it is so important for drivers to understand their responsibility to move over or slow down when encountering these situations.

Motorists who encounter a stopped emergency vehicle or roadside service vehicle must move into a lane that is not the lane nearest the parked or standing vehicle. Stay in the alternate lane until you pass the emergency or service vehicle. If the motorist cannot change lanes, then they must slow their vehicle and carefully proceed. Penalties include a fine of \$263.50, 3 points and license suspension.

Please remember to always pay attention to the roadway when driving and avoid distractions.

Raymond Fire and Rescue Department covers rural roads and county highways. However, the most dangerous area of coverage is part of the I-94 corridor. Keep emergency personnel safe by moving over and slowing down when you see emergency lights. The Raymond Fire and Rescue Department members have families waiting for their return.
