Wisconsin Department of Transportation's Traffic Incident Management Enhancement (TIME) Program Training

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation's TIME Program will present a 4-hour responder training session on WisDOT's Emergency Traffic Control and Scene Management Guidelines.



WisDOT's Emergency Traffic Control and Scene Management Guidelines were established to provide incident responders within the state of Wisconsin a uniform approach to emergency traffic control and scene management. Having a uniform approach will help provide the safest possible work environment for all incident responders, minimize the risk for secondary crashes and aid in clearing an incident in a quick and effective manner. Class topics include:

- National Incident Management System (NIMS) and Incident Command System (ICS)
- Responder safety fundamentals
- Scene size-up and communications
- Traffic incident management area establishment
- Scene breakdown and demobilization
- Traveler information
- Hazardous materials response
- Helicopter emergency medical services landing zones
- Crash investigation/reconstruction
- Clearance/removal operations
- Emergency alternate routes
- Post incident debriefings

This training is recommended for ALL incident responders, including law enforcement, fire, EMS, highway department, department of public works, medical examiners/coroners and towing and recovery personnel. There is no cost for this training. Attendees will be provided with a field operations guide. Upon completion of the course, attendees will be provided with a certificate of completion.
