



WI State Capitol Police Guidance on Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS)



If you suspect a UAS operation is unsafe or unauthorized:

1. Locate the operator and give them an opportunity to land safely
2. Ask for registration and verify markings on the UAS - Required for all UAS greater than 0.55 lbs
3. Ask operator for the type of operation and to present appropriate documentation
4. Interview operator and collect the following information:
 - a. Name, address, and positive ID of operator
 - b. Record the # from their Remote Pilot's License, if they have one (required for all commercial ops)
 - c. Document time, place, and details of flight (take pictures and interview witnesses, etc)
5. Contact the FAA for:
 - a. Safety concern or serious UAS incident – contact the Regional Operations Center: 9-csa-roc@faa.gov
 - b. Investigation support – contact an FAA Law Enforcement Assistance Program (LEAP) Special Agent

<u>Model Aircraft—(Hobbyist)</u>	<u>Commercial/ Professional—(Part 107)</u> <i>Must adhere to the "Model" Standards, PLUS:</i>	<u>Government—(Any Public Entity)</u>
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Aircraft must have FAA registration # 2. Must give way to manned aircraft 3. Less than 55 pounds, and > 100 MPH 4. Fly no higher than 400' 5. Keep aircraft within eyesight 6. Do not fly directly over persons or vehicles 7. Stay at least 25' away from persons or vulnerable property 8. Contact airport if flying within 5 miles 9. Do not fly in adverse weather 10. Do not fly at night 11. Do not fly near or over sensitive infrastructure 12. Do not photograph people in an area where privacy is expected 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pilot-in-Command (PIC) must have an FAA 'Remote Pilot Airman Certificate' 2. Must obtain clearance from ATC when operating in Class B, C, D, and E airspace. 3. Subject to all rules of 14 CFR part 107 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Must comply with all rules of Part 107, OR 2. Must obtain Certificate of Authorization or Waiver (COA) 3. PIC must have Remote Pilot Airman Certificate
<p>In Summary—ALL UAS: Must have Registration and Markings (<0.55 lbs) Must not endanger persons or property on the ground Must give way to and not interfere with manned aircraft Must comply with all flight restrictions and Temporary Flight restrictions Are subject to legal enforcement for Careless or Reckless operation</p>
