ENVIROMENTAL JUSTICE PROCESS

As WisDOT considers, develops, and designs projects throughout the state, we are mindful of environmental justice. As a recipient of federal financial assistance, WisDOT works closely with the **Federal Highway Administration** (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) in implementing the Executive Order and these agencies' accompanying policy directives, which include the **DOT Order on Environmental Justice, FHWA** order on Environmental Justice, and the FTA Circular on **Environmental Justice to achieve** environmental justice.

WisDOT's actions and decisions are guided by the three fundamental principles of environmental justice, which are:

- To avoid, minimize or mitigate disproportionately high and adverse human health and environmental effects, including social and economic effects on minority populations and lowincome populations
- To ensure the full and fair participation by all potentially affected communities in the transportation decision-making process
- To prevent the denial of, reduction of or significant delay in the receipt of benefits by minority and low-income population

WELCOME to FFY25



Consistent data collection on Good Faith Effort, after-contract modifications and trending regional information has helped the DBE Program flourish and thrive. As a federally funded program, we believe transparency and stakeholder collaboration is the key to continued success.

Newsletters such as this one and the DBE Reporter along with conference events and regular stakeholder meetings play a critical role in this program helping all DBE firms achieve their goals. Success in a program is never due to just one factor - it is a combination of everyone's efforts, big and small.

In September 2024, the DBE Office collaborated with Construction Business Group and WTBA for the DBE Roundtable 4.0, and on Jan. 29-30, 2025, our office will host the Annual DBE Workshop and Networking Summit in Wisconsin Dells. 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Federal Highway Administration's Mobile Asphalt Technology Center (MATC)

WisDOT staff recently had the opportunity to learn about cutting-edge technology and innovation in asphalt paving during a visit from the Federal Highway Administration's Mobile Asphalt Technology Center (MATC). The MATC is a traveling pavement lab, equipped with the latest tools and resources to help pavement professionals better understand their challenges and opportunities on a localized level. MATC staff used pavement from a nearby project in equipment demonstrations. The MATC visit is part of WisDOT's ongoing commitment in delivering safe, durable, and cost-effective roadways throughout Wisconsin.

- REVIEW the region and proposal breakdown; and
- UTILIZE it as an additional resource, so your company is considering and including ALL potential DBE sub-contractable opportunities in your DBE solicitation and outreach efforts.

TIPS FOR FINDING DBE OPPORTUNITIES

- Review the proposal(s) your company is bidding on and the selected work types identified in your solicitation.
- Compare that against the WisDOT DBE Opportunities breakdown per region and proposal.
- Are there DBE opportunities your company is missing and/or did not consider?

- your DBE solicitation letter to include more descriptive work types rather than larger/generic work types such as "landscaping" or "traffic control"
- your DBE solicitation letter, website and/ or other DBE outreach that – when feasible, your company will consider small work packages for DBEs
- ► PROACTIVELY WORK with first tier hiring subcontractors and carefully evaluate their quotes for DBE participation that might have been missed

Incomplete and/or Inaccurate Attachment As:

Recently, we have seen an increase in Attachment As that are either incomplete and/or inaccurate. The DBE Office will follow-up after bids are posted to provide a friendly reminder, but we also ask that prime contractors have a process in place to catch and correct AA issues before submitting them.

The most common Attachment A issues:

In the First Section:

 The Proposal ID, Proposal Number and/or Date is incorrect

In the Second Section:

- The prime contractor and hiring subcontractor names are reversed or only the hiring subcontractor name is listed.
 - The prime contractor name is FIRST. The hiring subcontractor name is SECOND
- The Total DBE Credit Value differs from the amount electronically entered into BidX. Sometimes this is off by pennies, so please double check all amounts for accuracy.

Bin file reminder:

If you do not see a DBE in the Bid Express .bin file but know the DBE has been newly certified – please submit a PDF DT1506 and Attachment A for that DBE if you are entering DBE credit electronically. If you are attaching a PDF DT1506 instead of electronic entry, add the DBE to the commitment. We will review and confirm DBE credit and combine into one DBE commitment.



eSubmit has been upgraded. Bidders will now get an email notification that lists **ALL** uploaded documents. Please test the platform prior to bid letting day and reach out to **DBE_Alert@dot.wi.gov** if you encounter any issues.

It is recommended that your company has a GFE 1:1 at least once a year with WisDOT.

GFE Reminders

The best way to demonstrate Good Faith Effort (GFE) is by meeting the assigned DBE goal. However, we always recommend that prime contractors continue to work with DBEs during the ENTIRE BID LETTING – the DBE Office considers NEUTRAL DBE participation on the GFE Rubric also a demonstration of Good Faith Effort.



IN SEPTEMBER 2024, there were (13) proposals with an assigned DBE goal. There were (2) GFE requests that were approved on awarded bids in the NW and NE regions. WisDOT ended FFY2024 with (9) approved GFE requests.

INTENT TO AWARD TIPS

TIP 1: WisDOT looks at both the **percentage difference** and **dollar difference** as it relates to the **total bid amount**. Keep in mind when selecting "cost difference between quotes is unreasonable" that a \$5,000 price difference between quotes on a \$500,000 total bid (1.00%) is different than a \$5,000 price difference between quotes on a \$15,000,000 total bid (0.03%). In the latter scenario, are there factors other than cost that are impacting your awarding decision?

TIP 2: On the Intent to Award Tab in the DT1202 Excel Workbook, **Column F requires an explanation** even when multiple DBEs quote a work type. Even though your company may have selected another DBE, simply stating "awarded another DBE" is not sufficient.

TIP 3: Consider also documenting "why" you awarded a DBE, especially when other DBEs have been rejected for the same work category. This can provide additional context and insight why a DBE has been rejected.

TIP 4: Consider including a line-item analysis even for smaller work types and document your awarding rationale in this section. Don't forget to consider "other tangible factors" that come into play other than cost, such as delivery to the job site or subcontractor is local/closer to the job site.

TIP 5: WisDOT recommends greater scrutiny when a DBE quote is rejected, and the assigned DBE goal could have been achieved. This scenario often comes up when a DBE provides 100.00% DBE participation, and a non-DBE is selected with either partial or 0.00% DBE participation (see OBOEC Rubric Analysis_Feedback Tab (5)(c)(d) in the DT1202 Excel Workbook).

TIP 6: Self-performing work reminder: Please remember to evaluate any DBE quote for a work type that your company is considering self-performing with more scrutiny. Prime contractors can almost always perform the work for less cost.
