"At this historic moment, the DBE program is more important than ever."

On behalf of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, I'm excited to welcome everyone to the 37th Annual Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Workshop and Networking Summit and Secretary's Golden Shovel Awards.

This This event has come a long way in more than three decades of service to the DBE community, but the fundamentals are the same – helping Wisconsin's hardworking DBE firms compete effectively for transportation construction work. To expand participation, this year's event includes a virtual option, and we extend our warmest welcome to everyone joining at home or in the office as well as in-person in Wisconsin Dells.

This is a time of great opportunity for improving Wisconsin's transportation infrastructure. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) is adding more than \$1 billion to state transportation programs over five years. BIL will help us push forward with many projects in which WisDOT and prime contractors will need the skill and dedication of DBE firms to deliver for our communities.

Together, we'll continue to face the challenges of turning BIL funding into safe, useful infrastructure for Wisconsin communities. It's important that we continue to communicate actively about those challenges – workforce issues, supply chains and staying on schedule to maximize this opportunity.

Positive momentum is on our side, with so many significant and innovative projects completed in 2022. The Flex Lane on US 12/18 in Madison is a first in Wisconsin to effectively move traffic during peak travel times. The WIS 29 and County VV interchange project in Brown County was also finished this past year and includes a number of important safety upgrades. The US 53/63 Trego interchange project is also nearly complete with enhancements that address safety.

At this historic moment, the DBE program is more important than ever. WisDOT continues to enable more emerging DBEs to reach their full potential. Improvements to the Good Faith Effort (GFE) administrative process and outreach to DBEs and prime contractors are allowing the program to better meet DBE and industry needs. These efforts are producing results: In Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2022 DBE commitments increased \$7 million from FFY 2021.

When the DBE program does well, everyone in Wisconsin benefits. The DBE program brings more dollars into our local communities, and we all enjoy the benefits of safe, high-quality infrastructure. We thank you for all the work you do for the DBE program, and we hope this year's conference will provide valuable opportunities for you to connect with industry partners.




