## 1.0 Authority

<u>s. 1.01, Wis. Stats.</u> establishes the State of Wisconsin as a sovereign entity. It also describes certain relationships with sovereign Indian nations. <u>s. 86.25(1), (2) and (3), Wis. Stats.</u>, authorizes a municipality to enter into agreements with the state.

## 2.0 General

As a sovereign entity, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is not bound by municipal ordinances. The department's guidelines on vegetation and roadside management apply to all highways under the jurisdiction of the department subject to the conditions found in HMM 02-15-10, Maintenance Within Municipalities. County Highway Department personnel perform highway maintenance activities on behalf of the department in accordance with these guidelines. If a municipality would like to manage WisDOT-maintained roadsides in accordance with its own ordinances, the municipality may request a written permit from the department to be allowed to perform the work. The department will not pay a municipality for work completed either with or without the benefit of a permit.

Regional Operations staff should consult with their regional tribal liaison to coordinate work involving Indian tribes.

## 3.0 Permits

The municipality should contact the WisDOT regional office responsible for the county where the proposed work will be located. They will be asked to provide the reason for the request and a complete description of the proposed work. This description should include detail drawings if appropriate, construction methods, types of materials, and the length of time needed to complete the work, after which a permit may be issued. If a permit is warranted, use Form DT1812, Application/Permit To Work on Highway Right of Way.

Include the following additional Special Permit Provisions:

- 1. All of the work will be subject to applicable Federal and State regulations.
- 2. The Municipality will pay all costs incurred in connection with the work.
