COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This hybrid Criminal Justice Instructor Development Course – (IDC) & Scenario Instructor Course is designed to provide instructors the knowledge, tools and understanding of the safety and administrative needs associated with scenario training and testing activities. It will also prepare Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board (LESB) certified officers to effectively administer and teach LESB approved curricula. This course will certify you for both LESB courses.

This course emphasizes teaching and learning techniques that promote active learning, support learners with a variety of learning preferences and needs, and generate continuous improvements in teaching and learning. It will also prepare instructor personnel to provide realistic, safe and effective preparatory level training and assessments, as well as to serve as a safety protocol aid (although not mandatory) for active law enforcement/jail, in-service and law enforcement/jail community training programs. The scenario portion of the course objectives are established through the roles and functions of the Safety Coordinator (SO) and the Exercise Control Officer (ECO) and common safety practices, as outlined in the scenario instructor training manual. Objectives included in the manual consist of; coaching techniques, debriefing techniques, evaluation, directing of role players and ensuring compliance with established safety protocols.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

To successfully complete the CJ-IDC & Scenario course, instructor candidates must:

- Present two teaching assignments to the class
- Present one scenario teaching assignment
- Pass a written/achievement examination with a grade of 80% or higher
- Demonstrate proficiency in adult learning and teaching techniques taught throughout the course
- Demonstrate administration of scenario-based training in a safe and effective manner throughout the course

PREREQUISITES:

Registration limited to: Law enforcement applicants who have acquired a minimum of 2½ years of full-time or at least 5,000 hours of certified occupational experience as a law enforcement or tribal law enforcement officer and have attained an associate degree or a minimum of 60-accredited semester credits or 90-accredited quarter credits.

Applicants must submit form DJ-LE-335, the *32-hour Criminal Justice Instructor Development Course Application* (paper form available on WILENET), to the training provider along with a copy of their ACADIS Training History Report to verify occupational experience to enroll in the CJIDC, as well as form DJ-LE-310, *Student Release of Information* (paper form available on WILENET).

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement, (ARIDE) is a 16-hour course that was developed by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, (NHTSA) to address the gap in training between Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) and the Drug Evaluation and Classification (DEC) training.

This course will cover:

- SFST skills refresher
- Advanced sobriety tests
- Common/trending drugs of abuse
- Driving while impaired by drugs
- How drugs affect the human body
- Observable effects drug combinations
- Medical conditions that mimic drug impairment
- Pre & post arrest procedures
- Legal update with pertinent case law relating to OWI and drugged driving cases.

Officers looking for a SFST review and a better understanding on drugs that impair driving are highly encouraged to take this course.

Must be NHTSA certified in Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST).

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course prepares law enforcement professionals to effectively administer and teach the Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated (OMVWI)/Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) training program. Emphasizes teaching and learning techniques that promote active learning, support learners with a variety of learning preferences and needs and generate continuous improvement in teaching and learning.

OBJECTIVES:

The first part of this course will focus on the basic principles and techniques of teaching OMVWI/SFST, and on the specific application of those principles and techniques to the curriculum employed for classroom training in SFSTs. During this day the student-instructors become able to:

- Describe the documents that make up the standard curriculum packages for OMVWI/SFST;
- Describe the content and format of the lesson plans for OMVWI/SFST;
- Describe the characteristics of a good OMVWI/SFST instructor;
- Carry out the instructor preparation tasks for any session of the OMVWI/SFST course;
- Describe how to plan and manage an alcohol workshop;
- Administer the use of NHTSA-approved video tapes for optional SFST training.
- During the second part of the course, the student-instructor will have opportunities to apply what they have learned by teaching selected portions of the OMVWI/SFST course. The instructor candidates will be told their practice teaching assignments on the first day of the course, and they will have time in class on the first day to begin preparing for the assignments.

PREREQUISITES:

- Satisfactorily completed either the 32-hour Wisconsin Criminal Justice Instructor Development Course (CJIDC) or the Teaching Methods Course put on by the Wisconsin Technical College System;
- Satisfactorily completed SFST training, based on the NHTSA SFST curriculum or its equivalent;
- Participated in two "live" volunteer drinking subject practice sessions (alcohol workshops) during which they personally administered the horizontal gaze nystagmus, walk and turn, and one-leg-stand test to persons who have consumed alcohol; or
- Participated in one "live" volunteer drinking subject practice session (alcohol workshop) during which they personally administered the horizontal gaze nystagmus, walk and turn, and one-leg-stand test to persons who have consumed alcohol, and participated in one NHTSA approved video-taped session of drinking subjects; or
- Participated in two NHTSA approved video-taped sessions of drinking subjects; and
- Demonstrated continued proficiency with the SFSTs, either in actual enforcement operations or in alcohol workshops, or both, since the completion of their training.
- **NOTE: Anyone enrolling in this course is expected to know SFST skills prior to attending the course. This is an instructor course. A practical and written pre-test will be administered at the start of the course. If you do not pass these tests you will not be allowed to continue in the course.**

Are you looking to become a master at traffic law? This course is designed to build upon basic traffic enforcement skills learned during the DOJ's 720-hour Police Academy. It is primarily intended to provide enhanced skills and increased efficiency for those officers who already conduct traffic enforcement measures. Students can expect an exhaustive look into traffic related statutes, discussion on optimum enforcement strategies, and recognition of contributing factors and/or common violations precipitating traffic crashes.

This course deals only peripherally with Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) operations and Chapter 348 (Size, Weight, and Load). Those topics are covered more comprehensively in our sister program "Motor Carrier Enforcement (Truck Law)."

- Chapter 347 Equipment of Vehicles

This course is designed to provide the law enforcement officer an A to Z format in dealing with Commercial Motor Vehicles (CMV) during traffic stops. This course is designed primarily to train officers in skills necessary to recognize size/weight violations and the enforcement of Chapters 347 and 348. Officers will be provided concentrated instruction in motor carrier laws and their enforcement; specifically Chapters 194, 341, 343 (CDL), 346 (CMV OI), 347 and 348.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Identify traffic law violations that pertain specifically to commercial motor vehicles.
- Identify what vehicles are subject to IFTA and IRP and requirements for credentials.
- Identify Commercial Driver's License classes, endorsements and restrictions.
- Identify different types of operation – private or for-hire.
- Identify equipment violations.
- Demonstrate the ability to determine a vehicle's axle groups and overweight violations.
- Identify requirements for oversize/overweight permits and the credential requirements.
- Identify legal size, weight and load requirements.

This course is designed to provide an introduction into highway criminal interdiction as it pertains to the role of a patrol officer. It will provide a basic knowledge of what an officer may observe/hear while on patrol during their regular duties, to included, but not limited to: drug identification, methods of concealment, and different methods of ingestion. The training will cover verbal and non-verbal indicators of criminal activity.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- HCI Safety Considerations
