

Purpose

Our objective is to update you on the project scope and schedule and obtain your input on the identified needs, proposed alternatives, traffic impacts and real estate needs on US 51 at the County K/Swamp Lake Road intersection in the Oneida County towns of Nokomis and Cassian.

The purpose of the proposed action is to improve safety at the US 51 intersection at County K/Swamp Lake Road while maintaining acceptable traffic operations.

The need for the proposed improvements is to reduce the number and severity of crashes at the intersection and maintain the traffic operations at the intersection. The primary crash type at this intersection includes southbound rear-end and angle collisions associated with the left-turn movements from US 51 to County K or the driveway to the gas station in the northeast quadrant of the intersection. The US 51 and County K/Swamp Lake Road intersection has had 12 crashes from 2019 to 2023; two resulted in fatalities and three in injuries. Of the 12 crashes, six were right-angle crashes, and two were rear-end crashes.

Project Information

The following alternatives are proposed to improve safety at the US 51 and County K/Swamp Lake Road intersection:

- Alternative #1: Constructing north- and southbound left-turn lanes and a northbound right-turn lane.
- Alternative #2: Constructing north- and southbound left-turn lanes; a northbound off- set right-turn lane; and a raised median on the County K approach.
- Alternative #3: Constructing a multilane roundabout with two-lane approaches on northand southbound US 51. Single-lane approaches would be used for the County K and Swamp Lake Road approaches.

Proposed Traffic Impacts

Construction is currently scheduled to occur in spring/summer 2027.

US 51 is anticipated to remain open to traffic during construction. Traffic control will depend on the alternative selected and is anticipated to consist of flagging operations, staged construction, single-lane and shoulder closures and/or the possible closure of side roads.

Local, business and emergency access will be maintained throughout construction. However, temporary driveway closures will be necessary during parts of the construction process. Project staff will contact property owners in advance of closing a driveway.

Real Estate

Temporary and permanent real estate acquisition might be necessary for making intersection improvements depending on the alternative chosen. If needed, WisDOT expects to begin real estate acquisition in the summer/fall of 2025.

Access Modifications

During the design process, driveway access will be assessed for potential modifications during construction. Direct mailings and coordination will occur with property owners.
