This letter is intended to provide notification of an upcoming Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) bridge rehabilitation project. Any comments received will be documented in the review process. The WisDOT project team appreciates your participation and comments on this proposed project.

Project Description

CORRE Inc., on behalf of WisDOT, is preparing plans for the proposed undertaking along 0.1 mile of US 10 extending approximately 225 feet from each side of the Lindsay Creek Bridge west of Eleva. Proposed work consists of:

- Overlaying the bridge deck with concrete
- Making concrete surface repairs
- Adding stainless steel flashing along edge of deck
- Cleaning and painting bearings
- Painting girder ends
- Adding concrete pavement approach slabs
- Replacing guardrail

The project is needed to preserve the function, operation and safety of this bridge in the overall transportation system. The anticipated construction is currently scheduled for the summer of 2028.

Proposed Real Estate Impacts

No real estate impacts are anticipated for this project.

Proposed Traffic Impacts

US 10 will be closed to through traffic during construction. Traffic will be detoured to WIS 37 north to I-94 east to WIS 93 south back on to US 10.

Preliminary design began: Fall 2023
Final plans and specifications submittal: May 2027
Scheduled construction: Summer 2028
