Purpose

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is in the process of developing plans for proposed replacement of the culvert at the branch of the Middle River in the village of Poplar. The purpose of this handout is to provide information regarding the proposed improvements, describe the potential impacts and offer an opportunity for public comment.

Your comments assist us in developing a project that will serve the needs of the traveling public as well as the needs of the local community and are welcomed and appreciated throughout the design process.

Included at the end of this handout is a comment form that may be used for written comments regarding the proposed improvements. You are encouraged to fill out this form and return it. Comments may also be submitted via email or phone to the contact listed below.

Project location

The project is in the village of Poplar just east of River Road.

The project will be constructed with Project ID 1180-00-04(74) to replace the culvert at the unnamed drainage way west of County D (https://wisconsindot.gov/Pages/projects/by-region/nw/us2poplar/default.aspx).

The two culvert projects are proposed to be completed at the same time to minimize roadway and trail traffic impacts.

Project purpose and need

There is a concrete arch culvert under the Tri-County Corridor Trail connected to a 6-foot metal pipe under US 2 with a partial concrete box culvert (C-16-0099). The entire bottom has washed out of the concrete arch pipe and the metal pipe under US 2 is rusted with erosion at the outlet end. The entire culvert system is deteriorated and beyond repair.

These culverts must be addressed to ensure that US 2 and the Tri-County Corridor Trail will continue to safely carry roadway and recreational traffic.

Proposed improvements

The proposed improvements would include:

- Remove existing culvert system under US 2 and the trail
- Install a new culvert under US 2 and the trail to safely pass a 100-year storm event
 - The culvert will be installed on a new alignment and the proposed improvements will address ongoing erosion at the culvert.
 - The project includes construction of an outlet channel along the north side of US 2 to address environmental requirements.
- Replace the living snow fence along the north side of US 2 that is impacted by the project.
 - o The living snow fence aids in reducing snow drifting across US 2.

- Restore the impacted pavement and trail surfaces.

Proposed traffic impacts

Construction is currently scheduled for 2027.


- Traffic will be maintained on US 2 during construction except a short-term detour is planned during pipe replacement under the roadway.
 - US 2 traffic will be detoured on County F and WIS 13.
 - The anticipated detour is proposed to be in place for two to three weeks.
 - The property owners between the culverts will be required to use local routes to access US 2 during the detour timeframe.
- The Tri-County Corridor Trail will be detoured during construction.
 - The proposed detour is anticipated to be Lackson Road to Bayfield Road to Center West Line Road to Elm Road.
- Local and emergency access will be maintained to adjacent properties.
- Work is anticipated to occur between May and August.
- All work is dependent upon favorable weather conditions.

Real estate

The project will require new land interests to accommodate the culvert replacement. This will include areas of new right-of-way (fee) along the north side of US 2 from one property owner.

WisDOT expects to begin real estate acquisition in fall 2025. Direct mailings and coordination will occur with the impacted property owner. A landowner rights brochure is available for review on the project website.

- Concept plan development and agency coordination 2024
- Local official meeting Feb. 11. 2025
- Public involvement comment period February/March 2025
- Environmental document Spring 2025
- Preliminary plans Spring 2025
- Final right-of-way plat Summer 2025
- Right-of-way acquisition Summer 2025 to Spring 2026
- Final plans May 1, 2026
- Construction Summer 2027
