















Project Location

- About WIS 27:
 - Minor arterial
 - Typical section:
 - Two 12-foot lanes
 - 5-foot paved shoulders
 - Average Annual Daily Traffic County: 4,455, 18.7% truck traffic
 - Deer Tail Creek Bridge / **Ambrose Road**





















Project Information

- Project Purpose:
 - Preserve the roadway and maintain the utility of the corridor for agricultural, recreational, residential and commercial travel.
- Project Needs
 - Pavement deterioration
 - Outdated traffic signal equipment
 - Outdated railroad crossing and signals
 - Guardrail that doesn't meet design standards
 - Non-ADA-compliant curb ramps











Proposed Improvements

- Alternative 1: No build
- Alternative 2: Pavement resurfacing (Preferred alternative)
 - Roadway:
 - Remove the top layer (approximately 2 inches) of asphalt.
 - Place 3 inches of new asphalt.
 - Bridge:
 - Make concrete surface repairs to the Deer Tail Creek Bridge.















Proposed Improvements

Other project work includes:

- Upgrading the railroad crossing and railroad signals south of US 8.
- Upgrading traffic signals and sidewalk curb ramps.
- Replacing or repairing culverts.
- Repairing an embankment.
- Cleaning ditches.
- Making spot curb and gutter repair.
- Replacing guardrail and pavement markings.
- Completing shouldering work.













Proposed Traffic Impacts


- Motorists will encounter:
 - Temporary lane closures controlled by flaggers.
 - Roadway will reopen to traffic by the end of the workday.
 - Temporary traffic signals at Deer Tail Creek to maintain a single lane of traffic.
 - Detour required for railroad replacement area.
- School bus routes may be affected during construction.





Proposed Traffic Impacts

- Railroad crossing replacement will result in the temporary closure of WIS 27.
 - Proposed detour: US 8, WIS 73 and WIS 64
 - Closure: Estimated at approximately two weeks





















Potential Project Impacts

- Design impacts
 - Permanent and temporary right-of way impacts are expected for curb ramp upgrades.
 - Minor temporary easements may be required for culvert installations.
 - Wetland impacts are anticipated in culvert replacement and repair areas.

















Project Update/Next Steps

- Public comment period: August 2024 Sept. 13, 2024
- Final plan submittal: August 2027
- Construction: 2028
 - Construction could be advanced to 2027 if funding becomes available.
