#### **Purpose**

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is in the process of developing plans for proposed replacement of the drainage structures on WIS 73 in Rusk and Taylor counties. The purpose of this handout is to provide information regarding the proposed improvements, describe the potential impacts and offer an opportunity for public comment.

Your comments assist us in developing a project that will serve the needs of the traveling public as well as the needs of the local community and are welcomed and appreciated throughout the design process.

#### **Project location**

The projects are in the town of Lawrence (Rusk County) and the town of Cleveland (Taylor County).

#### Project purpose and need

The existing three 6-by-9-foot metal culverts (B-54-0744) were constructed in 1989 at Crazy Horse Creek. The culverts are deteriorated (rusting), and the roadway side slopes do not meet current roadside design standards because the culverts are too short.

The existing 16-foot concrete bridge (C-60-0803) at Fisher River was constructed in 1932 and is experiencing cracking and deterioration throughout the bridge. The existing deteriorated guardrail does not meet current roadside design standards.

#### **Proposed improvements**

#### Crazy Horse Creek

- Removing the three 6-by-9-foot metal culverts (B-54-0744)
- Constructing a three-cell concrete box culvert (B-54-0142)
- Grading side slopes to match the new culvert
- · Restoring the pavement and pavement marking at the culvert site

#### Fisher River

- Removing the existing 16-foot concrete culvert (C-60-0803)
- Constructing a single-cell box culvert (C-60-0022)
- Removing the existing guardrail
- Grading side slopes to match the new culvert
- · Replacing the culvert under Hooker Road
- Restoring the pavement and pavement marking at the culvert site

#### **Proposed traffic impacts**

Construction is currently scheduled for 2028.

The roadway will be closed at each culvert work area. WIS 73 through traffic would be detoured on WIS 64 to WIS 27 to US 8. See the enclosed detour map.


- Construction of both culverts is anticipated to occur at the same time.
- Access will remain open for local and emergency traffic between work areas.
- Access will remain open to Hooker Road, which is located within the Fisher River work zone.

Construction is anticipated to occur between June and September.

 Construction is anticipated to take approximately three months, pending favorable weather.

#### Real estate

The project will require new land interests to accommodate the structure replacements. This will include areas of new right-of-way (fee) and temporary (temporary limited easement) land acquisitions.

WisDOT expects real estate acquisitions to begin in Fall 2025. Direct mailings and coordination will occur with impacted property owners. A landowner rights brochure is available for review on the project website.

- Initial property owner notification Feb. 6, 2025
- Public comment period April/May 2025
- Preliminary plans complete Spring 2025
- Approve environmental and design reports Summer 2025
- Approve right of way plat No later than November 2025
- Real estate acquisition Fall 2025 to fall 2027
- Project bidding September 2027
- Construction 2028
