WIS 145 Resurfacing – WIS 100 to WIS 167

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is proposing to resurface 3.24 miles of WIS 145 in Waukesha and Washington Counties.

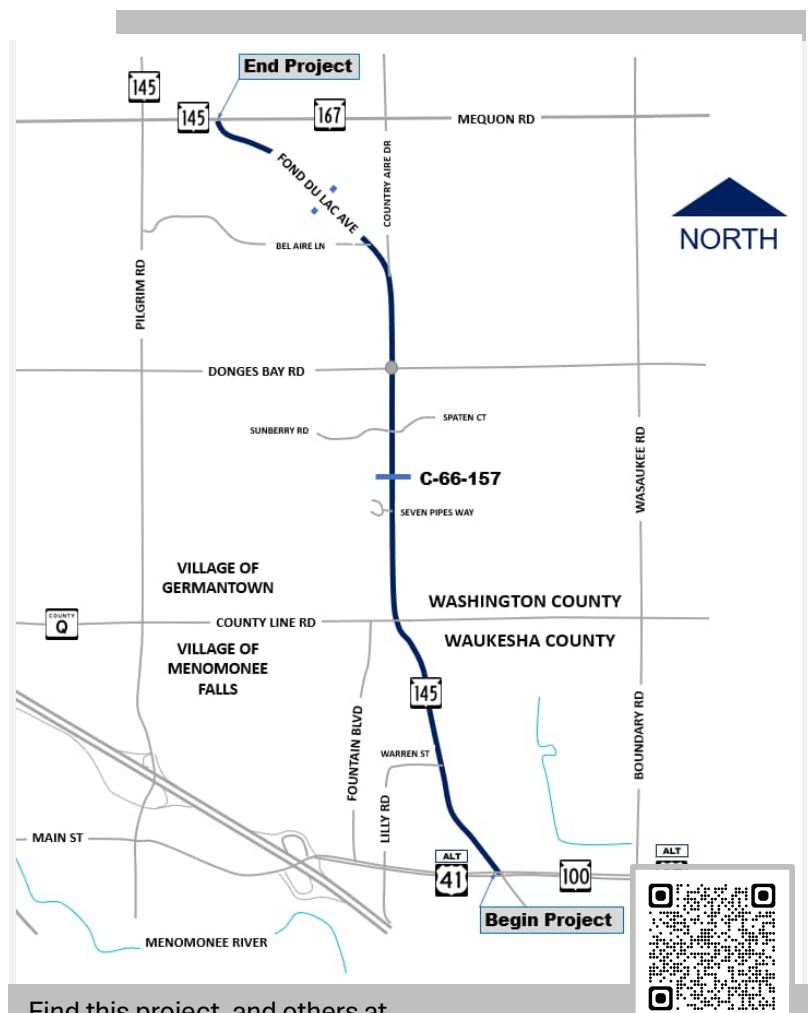
Proposed Improvements:

- Mill and overlay existing asphalt pavement.
- Reconstruct existing curb ramps.
- Remove one and replace six guardrails.
- Replace traffic signal at County Q and WIS 145 intersection.
- Replace various cross culverts and improve drainage.

Traffic Impacts

Construction is anticipated to **start in summer of 2026**. WIS 145 will be closed from WIS 100 to WIS 167. A detour will be posted utilizing WIS 100 (Main Street), I-41, and WIS 167 (Mequon Road). Access to local residences and businesses will be maintained.

The purpose of this project is to provide long-term improvements to the pavement, operation, and safety of the roadway.
