WIS 33 and County B Intersection  
Dodge County

Please join us for a public involvement meeting to discuss the WIS 33 and County B intersection, located in the Town of Beaver Dam, Dodge County.

The meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., at the Beaver Dam High School Commons, located at 500 Gould Street, Beaver Dam, WI 53916. The Commons area is immediately adjacent to the front entrance of the High School. The meeting will follow an open house format.

The purpose of this project is to improve safety at the intersection of WIS 33 and County B. The intersection is currently controlled with stop signs. In a five-year analysis period, the intersection recorded 17 crashes. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is proposing to address the purpose and need of the project by providing a traffic signal with left-hand turn lanes on southbound WIS 33 and County B. Other project work will include installing curb and gutter and storm sewer. The construction year for this project is 2028.

The objective of this meeting is to present project information to the public and gather input from property owners that helps develop the design.
