The enclosed Environmental Survey Request concerns proposed updates to Metra's Hiawatha Service between Chicago and Milwaukee. A review of potential impacts to historical, archaeological, and architectural properties for this project was completed by IDOT's Cultural Resources staff. An archaeological survey was not required for this project as it requires no new right-of-way.

The overall project entails five improvements: Glenview Crossover, Lake Forest Crossover, Deerfield Holding Track, UPRR Siding Extension at A-20, and a speed increase between A-20 and Rondout. The project basically involves new track, signals, sidings, crossovers (at-grade links between sets of tracks), new railroad bridges, and retaining walls. Two buildings listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) are adjacent to the project area (Chicago & Northwestern Railway Power House in Chicago; and the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Passenger Depot in Deerfield), while two other depots/stations have previously been determined NRHP-eligible (Union Station in Chicago; and the Metra Station in Golf). None of the work will impact the historic resources near the project area.

In coordination with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), IDOT requests the concurrence of the State Historic Preservation Officer in our determination that no historic properties subject to protection under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 will be affected by the proposed project. In accordance with 36 CFR Part 800.3(c)(4), the FHWA will proceed to the next step in the Section 106 process if we do not receive a response from your office within 30 days.
